HB 149	**	Senate Public Safety 1/8/18	Powell (32) Lumsden (12) Collins (68) Jasperse (11) Gravley (67)	This bill provides for comprehensive regulation of trauma scene cleanup services, as well as licensing, registration and qualifications of providers; rules and regulations; and penalties for providers. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/149	2nd year bill that was recommitted by the Senate Public Safety Committee. An overdue bill.
HB 635	**	Senate Health and Human Services Committee 2/20/18	Cooper (43) Benton (31) Jones (53) Broadrick (4) Reeves (34)	Elder Abuse Bill - Act provides for at-risk adult protective investigative/ coordinating teams in each judicial circuit. http://www.legis.ga.gov/legislation/en-US/Display/20172018/HB/635	Establishes investigative and coordination teams for the abuse, neglect, exploitation of disable and elderly in each judicial circuit. A very good bill to protect our elderly.
HB 673	**	Senate Judiciary 3/1/18	Carson (46) Lumsden (12) Golick (40) Trammell (132) Smith (134)	Distracted Driver Bill Prohibits drivers from using wireless phones in a manner that distract a driver. http://www.legis.ga.gov/legislation/en-US/Display/20172018/HB/673	Prohibits texting and reading hand-held devices. Also provides for tiered administrative fines to be levied in addition to that provided by local courts. This is a very good bill and has been embraced by the GACP via a GACP Resolution.

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HB 703	**	Senate Public Safety 2/28/18	Hitchens (161) Lott (122) Powell (32) Frazier (126) Welch (110)	Creates the Office of Public Safety Support within the Georgia Department of Public Safety to respond to and provide counseling services for public safety officers involved in incidents including death and other tragedies. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/703	This program will support the peer support legislation that was passed last year. The association is very supportive of this legislation.
HB 751	**	Senate Public Safety 2/14/18	Powell (32) Rogers (10) Rhodes (120) Efrstration (104) Jasperse (11)	Establishes the Georgia Emergency Communications Authority, with its primary purpose being to administer, collect, audit, and remit 911 revenues as well as study, evaluate, recommend technology standards for 911 systems; identify changes to make 911 systems more effective and efficient, identify training needs, recommend minimum standards for public safety answering points. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/751	Over the last three years, "911" bills have been introduced and failed. Last year, the Governor vetoed the 911 bill for good reason. This bill is well-written and hopefully will pass.

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HB825	**	Senate Judiciary 2/26/18	Williams (145) Collins (68) Gravley (67) Bentley (139) Hitchens (161)	Authorizes the Chief medical examiner to inter unidentified human remains after officers have exhausted all efforts to identify the remains. The bill also authorizes the medical examiner to disinter the remains when it is determined further information can be obtained or testing may result in the identification. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/825	This is a good Bill. Enables the crime lab to bury the remains for unidentified bodies currently being maintained in the morgue.
HB826	**	Senate Public Safety 2/23/18	Caulbe (11) Welch (110) Rutledge (109)	Allows alarm companies to immediately dispatch law enforcement to a location without first or second verification when the customer has entered an agreement to have no alarm verification be made. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/826	Modification was made to the initial bill limit applicability to banking institutions, wholesaler or retailers of pharmaceuticals or firearms dealers. These facilities would still be held accountable for false alarms under the local community's ordinances.
HB 867	**	Senate Public Safety 2/26/18	Hitchens (161) Lumsden (12) Williams (145) Petrea (166) Tanner (9)	Changes the quorum required for POST Council meetings to increase from seven to eleven members. Allows investigators to retain their weapons upon retirement; Eliminates requirement for persons who fail the academy entrance exam to wait 30 days before they retake the exam; Eliminates the code section relating to training and certification of police chaplains. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/867	Very good bill.

HB898	*	Senate Public Safety 2/28/18	Powell 932) Ridley (6) Trammell (132) Hatchett (4)	Bill redefines fleets from 1000 to 100 vehicles, removes revalidation decal requirements, and allows transfer of tags between vehicles in same fleet. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/898	
HB978	*	Senate Public Safety 3/1/18	Nimmer (178) Coomer (14) Carpenter (4) Corbett (174) Rhodes (120) Holcomb (81)	Change punishments for civil penalties associated with video recording of persons improperly passing school busses. It also permits the installation of automated traffic speed detection devices that photographically record images of violations in school zones and outlines the administration of civil fines for vehicles travelling more than 12 mph above the posted limit. Fee is assessed to the registered owner. SB257	**	House Agriculture and Consumer Affairs 2/5/18	Heath (31)	Requires officers to consult with veterinarian employed or approved by Dept. of Agriculture prior to filing criminal charges for cruelty to animals in certain instances http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/SB/257	Bill requires officers to consult with designated veterinarians regarding conduct involving animal husbandry of cattle, swine, goats, or sheep to confirm whether or not such conduct is in accordance with customary and standard practice, prior to filing cruelty to animal charges. GACP is monitoring this bill.
SB 319	**	House Insurance Committee 2/23/18	Albers (56) Mullis (53) Gooch (51) Miller (49)	Consolidation of Fire Safety Services in Georgia Act establishes the Department of Fire Safety. Unifies all fire related services of the State under the newly established position of Commissioner of Fire Safety, and Fire Safety Board; transfers duties of Commissioner of Insurance as the Safety Fire Commissioner; http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/SB/319	Unifies fire services under a central source to provide better coordination.

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SB 327	**	House Judicial Non-civil 1/30/18	Albers (56) Harper (7)	Bill designed to clarify when a medical examiner's inquiry is required to be conducted. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/SB/327	Very good bill to help our GBI partners.
SB 336	**	House Judicial Non-Civil 3/1/2018	Unterman (45) Miller (49) Butler (55) McKoon (29)	Bill provides for when GBI issues a subpoena for production of electronic communication service records for computer or electronic devices that have been used in offenses against minors, the provider shall not provide notice of the subpoena to the subscriber or customer of the service. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/SB/336	Another good GBI related bill that should be embraced by law enforcement.
SB348	**	House Public Safety/ Homeland Security 2/20/18	Harper (7) Albers (56) Dugan (30) Anderson (43) Brass (28)	Relates to powers of arrest for campus police, define jurisdictional boundaries; and authorize technical colleges to enter mutual aid agreements. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/SB/348	Bill originally called for jurisdictional boundaries for technical colleges to be expanded to 500 yards to match the Colleges and Universities under the Board of Regents. But an amendment was passed on Senate floor to reduce the jurisdictional boundaries of both technical colleges as well as colleges and Universities under the Board of Regents to be reduced to 500 feet.

ACCG and GMA have worked with authors to address their needs.
SB367	**	House Public Safety and Homeland Security 2/20/18	Kirk (13) Gooch (51) Hill (4) Wilkinson (50) Harper (7)	Allows for payment of indemnification for death or disability to the officer's estate. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/SB/367	A reasonable bill.
SB368	**	House Public Safety and Homeland Security 2/20/18	Kirk (13) Gooch (51) Hill (4) Wilkinson (50) Harper (7)	Authorizes Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) to provide technical support and assistance to enhance agency's effectiveness. This includes, but not limited to equipment, grant funding, operations, and training. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/SB/368	Good idea, but many think CJCC already provides technical support and assistance based upon the financial guidelines placed upon them by the federal government.

Monies are to be submitted to the Peace Officers' Annuity and Benefit Fund. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/SB/369	This is a good bill and hopefully it will pass.
SB 407	**	House Judicial Non-Civil 2/28/18	Strickland (17) Walker (20) Stone (23) Miller (49) Martin (9)	Provides for Criminal Case Data Exchange to and from Superior Courts or any other State Court. Public access to the data shall remain the responsibility of the GCIC and no data shall be released by the Georgia Technology Authority. Also has provisions for release of persons being held on minor charges on personal recognizance or community service. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/SB/407	This is a good bill that will enable agencies to release indigent defendants on their own recognizance. This will help cities and counties reduce the costs associated with housing inmates in jail. The bill will also enable a statewide judicial data exchange program that will speed the exchange of data within the courts and reduce the need to repeatedly enter the data by multiple agencies.
SB 435	**	Senate Rules Committee 2/21/18	Beach (21) Jones (25) Watson (1) Miller (49) Jordan (6)	Change punishments for civil penalties associated with video recording of persons improperly passing school busses. It also permits the installation of automated traffic speed detection devices that photographically record images of violations in school zones and outlines the administration of civil fines for vehicles travelling more than 12 mph above the posted limit. Fee is assessed to the registered owner. 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HB 505	*	House Judiciary 3/1/17	Turner (21) Caldwell (20) Cantrell (22) Tarvin (2) Pezold (133)	Bill to amend civil forfeiture procedures to require criminal procedures be completed prior to civil forfeiture proceedings being held. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/505	This bill required seized assets to be held until the criminal charges result in a guilty plea, conviction, or acquittal. If the defendant is acquitted or charges are dismissed, the seized property returned. Proponents for this bill allege persons found innocent of criminal charges are having their property and money seized and forfeited to law enforcement.
HB660	*	House Judiciary Non-Civil 1/23/18	Hanson (80) Smyre (135) Willard (51) Drumer (85)	Hate Crime Bill Provides for additional punishment and additional torts for persons convicted of committing a crime that targeted victims for their race, color religion, national origin, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, or physical disability. http://www.legis.ga.gov/legislation/en-US/Display/20172018/HB/660	This was one of three hate crime bills. GACP supported this bill because it designated punishment for any crime committed based on victim's protected status, required training for officers as well as reporting to and by GCIC
HB737	**	House Rules Committee 2/5/18	Cox (108) Hitchens (161) Petrea (166) Powell (32)	Provides for court ordered blood tests of 'source individuals' when law enforcement officers have significant exposure to HIV, hepatitis B, hepatitis C. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/737	This is a very good officer safety bill.

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HB746	*	House Judiciary Non-Civil 1/29/18	Holcomb (81) Nguyen (89) Paris (142) Oliver (82) Gardner (57)	Requires all law enforcement agencies to provide policies for sexual assault victims; one officer to be trained in trauma & victim response; If agency cannot provide this, they must request GBI to investigate; provides victims right to consult with sexual assault victim advocate prior to forensic exam or law enforcement interview ; right to request the kit not be tested until a later time; agency must certify they are in compliance once a year. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/746	GACP staff has worked with author to address needs with model policy.

HB 837	**	House Judicial Non-Civil 2/7/18	Oliver (82) Cooper (43) Brenner (85) Dempsey (13) Holcomb (81)	Requires all law enforcement agencies to provide policies for sexual assault victims; one officer to be trained in trauma & victim response; If agency cannot provide this, they must request GBI to investigate; provides victims right to consult with sexual assault victim advocate prior to forensic exam or law enforcement interview ; right to request the kit not be tested until a later time; agency must certify they are in compliance once a year. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/837	Similar to HB 746

HB 865	*	House Judicial Non-Civil 2/12/18	Paris (142) Trammell (132) Thomas (39) Mitchell (88) Jackson 964)	Provides for possession of marijuana up to two ounces is a misdemeanor. Good bill for our personnel.

HB969	*	Postponed 2/26/18	Turner (21) Willard (51) Caldwell (20) Cantrell (22) Tarvin (2)	Bill Proposed changing burden of proof in civil asset forfeitures from preponderance of evidence to clear and convincing evidence. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/HB/969	GACP is opposed to legislation to establish higher standard of proof than current law. Georgia currently uses the same standard as required for federal asset forfeitures. Bill did not pass, but the topic may come up in future.

It is held up in Rules Committee
SB316	*	Senate Public Safety	Jackson (2nd) Jones (10th) Anderson (43rd) James (35th) Rhett (33)	Hate Crime Bill Provides for additional punishment for persons convicted of committing a crime because of the individuals race, color, religion, gender, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, national origin, or ethnicity. See (HB 663) http://www.legis.ga.gov/legislation/en-US/Display/20172018/SB/316	Bill designated punishment for six specific crimes committed against a victim because of protected status. This bill mirrored HB663 and lacks training for officers or reporting requirements to GCIC.
SB 343	*	Senate Public Safety 1/24/18	Harbison (15) Rhett (33) Davenport (44), James (35), Williams (39)	Bill prohibits POST Council from issuing and renewing drug recognition expert certifications. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/SB/343	Did not move out of committee.

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SB 408	*	Senate Public Safety 2/12/18	Jackson (2)	Requires that law enforcement or correctional officer shall make a good faith effort to have a mental or behavioral health professional present prior to interviewing an individual with autism or an autism spectrum disorder; Bill also requires all agencies to provide a policy and violations of this bill are grounds for suppressing the statement or evidence. Violation cannot be a cause of action against the officer or agency. http://www.legis.ga.gov/Legislation/en-US/display/20172018/SB/408	It is difficult to identify autism spectrum disorders in some individuals. Authority of this decision should be placed with the courts.

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
