Description:

This one day workshop will be presented on **Monday, November 2, 2020** and is designed to improve awareness and response to threats. An emphasis will be placed on common-sense steps that law enforcement officials can take for more cognitive, less emotional responses to threat scenarios. Key strategies will be highlighted to help law enforcement thoroughly evaluate violent threats, prevent violence and avoid liability.

This training will be presented by **Detective Loran Crabtree** who is employed as the Behavioral Threat Assessment Investigator for the Georgia Institute of Technology Police Department. Detective Crabtree is primarily responsible for threat assessments and threat management for students, staff, faculty, visitors, large scale events, and critical infrastructures. The scope of his assignment encompasses events and personnel mainly in Atlanta, GA, but encompass other remote locations along the east coast of the United States, France and China. Detective Crabtree also serves as the department's liaison to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Georgia Bureau of Investigations' GISAC and Customs and Border Protection. Detective Crabtree created and manages the Threat Assessment Working Group for state, local and federal law enforcement agencies in Georgia and the southeast.
