Georgia Association of Law Enforcement Chaplains (GALEC)

Training Scholarship Fund

Action Proposed

The Georgia Association of Law Enforcement Chaplains Corporate Board of Directors shall establish, administer and maintain a Training Scholarship Fund which shall be used to assist Applicants who desire to attend GALEC Basic and or Advanced Training Courses conducted by this corporation in conjunction with the Association referred to as GALEC and referred to as "The Association". The fund shall be comprised of designated donations from any source combined with the interest from the designated investments made by the corporation's Treasurer for that purpose.

The requirements for submitting an application for loans or grants from the above indicated fund shall be inclusive of the below and shall be screened by Scholarship Committee for compliance and applicability.

Grants or Loans may be awarded to Chaplaincy applicants:

- Individually, that are sponsored by a law enforcement agency that does not pay or reimburse the Chaplain's Training/Conference fee.
- Said Chaplain must be willing to become a member of, or remain an active member of The Georgia Association of Law Enforcement Chaplains (GALEC) (The Association).
- Said Chaplain must agree to maintain an active relationship with their sponsoring agency for at least one year, unless sooner discharged for cause.
- Said applicant must be endorsed by their local church leadership for their Chaplaincy Ministry.
- Said Chaplain must be able to articulate their reason for desiring financial assistance.
- Financial Assistance shall not exceed 50% of conference fee.
- The Awardee must abide by GALEC classroom/training attendance rules.
- Financial assistance will be paid directly to GALEC on the successful awardee's behalf.
- The financial award may be requested as a grant or a loan and should be indicated as such on the application
- Funds available will be determined by the GALEC Scholarship Account balance at the time of the application.
